

## Study at a vocational school

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There is an opinion that going to college is prestigious, but every fool can enter a vocational school. Today I can refute this misconception, since both of these institutions train junior specialists and provide them with bachelor's degrees.

Although I will not deny that there are some differences between college and school. The point is that a vocational school rather provides students with a basic education; while the job of colleges is to provide in-depth knowledge of a particular area of work.

In addition, do not forget that all schools have a narrower specialization, and their main orientation is directed more towards working specialties, in particular, a turner, a welder, a painter, a crane operator, a milling machine operator, etc.

Accordingly, it is possible to draw logical conclusions that in the technical school the bulk of students are representatives of the stronger sex, who in the future strive for engineering specialties in higher educational institutions, or for work in a mastered specialty. Among their ranks there are girls who have also chosen the profession of an engineer.

You can also add that on the territory of the Russian Federation in vocational schools and colleges it is quite possible to master any profession, and the list of specialties in the so-called "colleges" provides for more than 260 titles.

Passage of special courses with further obtaining a "crust"

In recent years, vocational courses have been especially popular, where a sufficient number of former schoolchildren who have decided not to enter the 10th grade are also studying. The period of study in these institutions is noticeably shortened, and sometimes corresponds to only a few months. This is a unique opportunity in the shortest possible time to get a "crust" about the profession you have mastered and immediately start working in your specialty.

The disadvantages of this form of education are shallow knowledge in the subjects studied, a superficial attitude towards learning and the absence of so-called "benefits" and incentives for further admission to a higher educational institution.

But, if the profession and place of work have already been determined in advance, and only a "crust" is not enough for complete happiness, then professional courses can be considered an ideal option in this matter. For example, a girl can master the specialty of a hairdresser, cook, masseuse, seamstress, beautician or accountant; and guys more often choose the profession of an electrician, plumber, welder.

It is worth clarifying right away that upon completion of studies, the graduate is issued a certificate of completion of the courses, but this document is not always taken into account when applying for a job. Many employers generally believe that such a "crust" is rather bought than earned by honest labor and their own efforts.

So, preparatory courses cannot be considered an excellent alternative to the 11th grade, since with such a decision you can finally "hack" the chance for further education at the university. It doesn't hurt to think once again that I, graduates, and I highly recommend!

Lyceum at the university, as a way to achieve the goal

If a ninth grade graduate, even in May, does not know who he plans to become in the future, then lyceums, which are specially created at a higher educational institution, will help him to determine the final choice, and closely preparing future applicants for admission.

The lyceum, or rather training within its walls, has a number of significant advantages, including a quick process of adaptation to a new educational institution; acquaintance and close cooperation with future teachers who are most likely to teach disciplines at the university. This is something in between a university and a school, but the prospects for studying in such a specialized lyceum are very bright.

The main disadvantage of this form of education is the insufficient funding of the student, that is, in addition to the absence of a vital scholarship, the student, or rather his parents, must also pay extra for education. Payment by semester, and the amount is not always affordable for this or that family.
